

Geneva Call mission

Geneva Call is a neutral, impartial and independent humanitarian organisation.

Its mission is to improve the protection of civilians in armed conflict through humanitarian engagement of armed actors on their respect for international humanitarian law.

This includes the protection of health care in times of armed conflict.





What is humanitarian engagement with armed non-State actors?

Humanitarian engagement

Sustained and constructive process of interaction with armed actors conducted for humanitarian purposes only.

Humanitarian engagement can take various forms, ranging from advocacy, negotiation, policy development and integration through training or public commitment to comply.

Armed conflict in Ukraine: complex emergencies?

Attack on and/or collateral damage on medical facilities

Lack of medical ressources: equipment and medication

Heavy administrative burden, exhaustive quality check, heavy control on cargo

Restrictions in population movements (conflict/COVID19)

Disruption of provision of health care

Deprivation of essential health care service



Broader public health impact

- Propagation of diseases
 - ✓ Lack of vaccinations
 - ✓ E.g. measles outbreak in Ukraine
- Lack of prevention and early detection

IHL obligations to respect and protect health care: facilities, personnel, vehicles and supplies

Negative obligations to respect

- Not attack or harm in any way
- Abstain from interference

Positive obligations to protect

- Measures to facilitate provision of health care
- Includes facilitation of passage medical supplies



Broad definitions:

- > All health care related functions
- ➤ Includes disease prevention, i.e. also vaccines



Humanitarian relief operations

Parties to the conflict must **allow and facilitate** rapid and unimpeded **humanitarian relief** for civilians in need **subject to their right to control**. Such relief must be impartial in nature and without adverse distinction







Humanitarian relief: Covers medical supplies

Right to Control: the question of consent

- Consent by whom? Question of State sovereignty
- > Arbitray witholding of consent

Allow and facilitate

- once consent is granted
- > Entry and movement within country
- > Technical arrangements



Research findings

Observed practice

- Limited integration of legal framework in doctrine
- Pragmatic interpretation of protection
- Disconnected: existence practical practice

Understanding the operational environment

- Sensitivity to protection activities
- Excess of scenarios
- Alternative objective existing practical measures

- Re-interpretating existing practical measures:
 - Evaluating impact
 - Recognise as contributions to protection
 - Expand applicability
 - Inclusive approach and diversification


Assess the availability and quality of care


Checkpoint procedures
